

Why are we asking these questions?

Question 1:

- What is your date of birth?
→ We ask this because the research mainly focuses on the experience of young people within the Amnesty movement.

Question 2:

- What is your postal code?
→ We ask this because we think geography can influence your experience with Amnesty

Question 3:

- In which way are you involved in Amnesty?
→ We ask this to better place your experiences and answers

Question 4:

- Which cultural/ethnic background(s) do you identify with?
→ We ask this because according to research ethnicity and culture can be an important part of who we are and how we experience environments, including the Amnesty environment.

Question 5:

- What is your highest obtained (or current) degree?
→ We ask this because we are curious about the educational backgrounds of the young people who get involved in the organization.

Question 5B:

- And that of your parents?
→ We ask this to try and identify the Social and Economic backgrounds of the young people who get involved in the organization

Question 6:

- What gender do you identify with?
→ We ask this because gender is an important part of identity and how we experience spaces, including the Amnesty environment.

Question 6:

- Which sexual orientation do you align with?
- What sexual orientation do you identify with?
→ We ask this because sexuality is an important part of identity and may be of influence in how we experience spaces, including the Amnesty environment. We also have campaigns in which this part of identity is often central such as “Let’s talk about Yes”.

Question 7:

- Do you experience any type of neurodiversity?

- a spectrum where people can fall within intellectual and sensory processing is different from the 'predominant neurotype' (e.g. AD(H)D or Dyslexia)
- ➔ We ask this because research shows neurodiversity is relevant in how we function (in spaces) and we are curious if (and to what extent) this can have an effect on the experience within Amnesty.

Question 8:

- Are you religious? If yes, with which religion are you connected?
 - ➔ We ask this because religion can be an important part of how we experience spaces, including the Amnesty environment.
